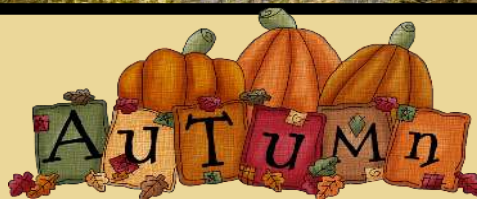

- Fort Pierre National Grasslands scoping letter for proposed prairie restoration research project.

Our Chapter has also had great success with our student mentorship program. Over the past few months several students have signed up and been matched with wildlife professionals that are able to provide guidance in career directions and opportunities, and to provide professional and academic advice. We are currently still looking for a member to chair the vacant Fundraising and Grassland Issues committees. We had planned on being in Rocky Mountain National Park the 3rd week of September but with the 60,000 acre fire on the west side and the Park Service closing the meadows to the public during the elk rut we decided to spend this fall photographing wildlife in the Black Hills. Since it was Mary Ann's week off I was the tripod carrier and didn't touch a camera.



It wouldn't be summer in SD without the bison rut this bull and cow were photographed in Wind Cave NP end of August.



Photographed antelope in Wind Cave NP and Custer SP, this young buck was practicing on a thistle plant along with leaving his scent.



Finding elk was pretty slow this year but in the prairie units there were some huge bulls harvested up to a 411 bull in the Cheyenne River unit, a friend of ours shot a 350 plus bull up there 100 yards from where the 411 was taken.



Mary Ann and I spent a day in Spearfish Canyon at the peak of color trying to find the mountain goats, the color was what you would expect and we did find number "45".



The last day of vacation for Mary Ann was the best, She found a bobcat in a prairie dog town lying by a prairie dog mound that was extremely cooperative, we haven't photographed a bobcat since we were stationed in Murdo, which was way before digital. One last vacation parting shot from Mary Ann.

We had a great late summer and early fall photographing SD wildlife. Can't wait until mid-October when the bighorn rams show up in the Badlands, we hope to find the 11 year old ram that we have photographed since 2015 here is the last image we have from December 2019!

Second, we discussed potentially including student or professional research briefs—to include an abstract, with a link to more information (e.g., a report, a poster, images, etc.)

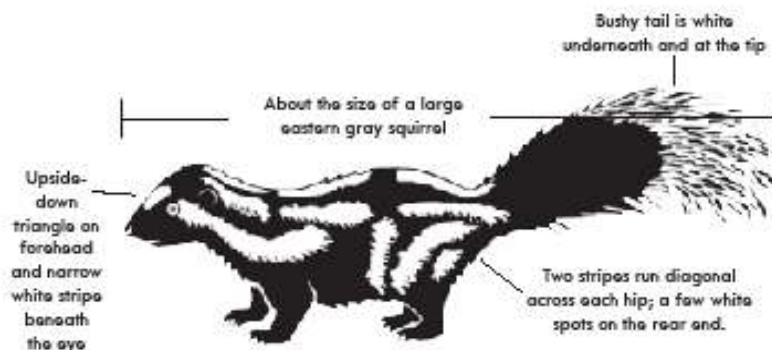

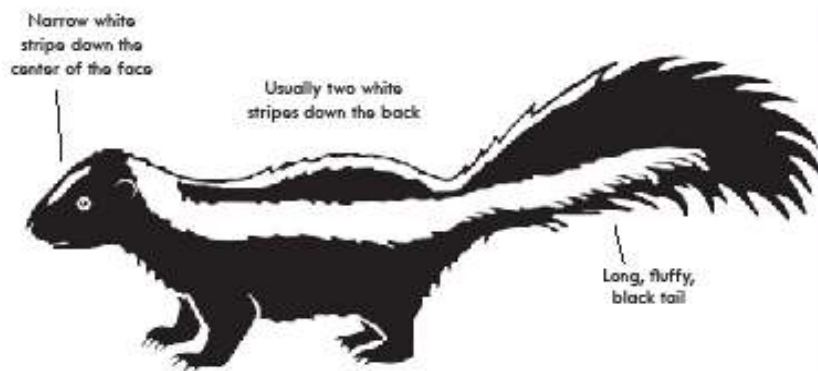

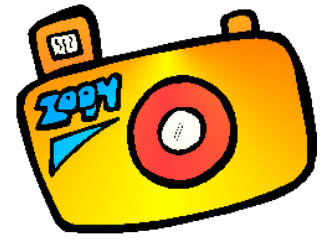
